Individualized support for women with gynecologic cancer

Woman to Woman is a unique support program that pairs patients who have gynecologic cancer with survivor volunteers who provide one-on-one emotional support and mentoring.

Mentors provide:

Understanding

Listening ear

Comfort and care


Empathy

One-on-one support

Companionship

Mentors meet one-on-one with mentees to listen, discuss concerns, provide support, and sometimes, just hold a hand.

Mentors are carefully matched to mentees based on cancer type, age, language and culture, patient preferences, and other relevant factors. They are professionally trained and supervised by a coordinator who oversees the program.



Who is eligible for the Woman to Woman program?

Any woman who has been diagnosed with gynecologic cancer and is receiving treatment at Northwestern Memorial Hospital by the Division of Gynecologic Oncology is eligible for the program.

Who are the volunteers?

Woman to Woman volunteers are survivors of gynecologic cancer who are professionally trained mentors.
